- facets: social, economic, and environmental sustainability. Despite the fact that the idea of sustainable development originally featured a strong social mandate, we contend that it is currently a notion in disorder, which seriously undermines its significance and usefulness. Fast economic growth has brought about great financial affluence, but it has also had a significant negative impact on the environment and has hastened the depletion of material resources. The neglected issue of social sustainability needs immediate attention if we are to guarantee a good standard of living for the nine billion people who will inhabit the planet in 2050 as predicted. Several localities experience extreme poverty as a result of a global split between and among societies. As a result, these communities are compelled to produce a variety of goods. Sustainability happens when official and informal systems, structures, connections, and processes actively support the potential of the present and future generations to build wholesome, livable communities. Communities that are socially sustainable offer a high standard of living and are democratic, diverse, connected, and equal. Understanding what people require from the places they live and work allows us to create socially viable communities that encourage wellbeing. Design for the social world and the physical world are combined to create social sustainability. In the last 40 years, the concept of "sustainability" has expanded to include three key facets: social, economic, and environmental sustainability. Nonetheless, the world's attention has primarily been on economic sustainability throughout this time. Social justice, community development, and human rights are all intimately tied to this idea. Communities that are socially sustainable are those in which residents can live in safety, health, and empowerment and have access to the opportunities and resources they require to prosper.
