1) Evaluate the effectiveness of using a prescriptive or descriptive K1(2) approach in teaching grammar. What are the potential advantages and disadvantages of each? 2) K2(4) Explain the structure and function of prepositional phrases. How do prepositional phrases contribute to sentence variety? 3) Outline the rules for making a simple sentence. Provide an K2(6) example and discuss how adherence to these rules ensures clarity and coherence. 4) K3(9) In a passage, identify all the verbs and categorize them as either intransitive or transitive. Discuss how recognizing verb types contributes to understanding the passage's meaning. "The sun set behind the mountains, casting a warm golden glow across the valley. Birds chirped melodiously in the trees, welcoming the peaceful evening. Maria baked a delicious apple pie, filling the kitchen with a tempting aroma. The cat lazily stretched on the windowsill, basking in the last rays of daylight." Develop a brief dialogue between two characters. Utilize 5) K3(9) intransitive and transitive verbs to add action and detail to the conversation. Reflect on how verb choice contributes to character expression. 6) K5(10) Evaluate a piece of writing and assess the precision of adverbial use. Discuss instances where more specific adverbials could enhance the clarity and effectiveness of the text. Excerpt from a Piece of Writing: "The speaker talked about the topic passionately. He spoke eloquently and expressed his ideas well. The audience listened attentively. The event went smoothly, and everyone seemed happy with the outcome." 7) K4(12) Define what a clause is in grammar. Differentiate between

independent and dependent clauses, providing examples for each. How do clauses differ from phrases and sentences?

Explore the nuances of using different modals to convey similar meanings. Discuss how subtle differences in modal choice contribute to variations in meaning and tone.
