- 6) Discuss the concept of "attempt" as defined in the Indian Penal Code. Provide a detailed analysis of the key elements required to establish an individual's guilt for attempting to commit a crime. Also, explain how the Indian legal system differentiates between an attempt and a completed offense, citing relevant case law if possible. K5(10)
- 7) A,B,C,D and E with a common object to take away ATM machine went to HDFC Bank ATM. A.B.C and D entered the ATMkiosk and started detaching the machine from the floor. E stood at a distance to warn them of any impending danger. As they were about to take away the ATM machine, a man came there to withdraw money, but he was assaulted by A, B,C and D.
