- 3) A decomposed body was found adjacent to a forest area. The body was decomposed to the extent that, it was not identifiable as of a human. The person who found the body informed it to his Panchayat officer. The Panchayat officer was reluctant to take any steps to report the incident to the officials. Describe the proceedings and the offices/agencies responsible to initiate criminal justice process in such occasions. K3 CO2 (7)

- "A", a minor girl aged 14 years was abducted by a group of 4 people including a woman. The abducted girl was kept in a house owned by the said woman. The 3 male members of the group sexually abused and killed the girl. Four of the culprits were arrested and detained in police custody. However, they were neither been produced before the court nor been informed about their rights against self-incrimination. Decide the criminal justice issues involved in such denial of rights for criminals. K3 CO2 (7)
4. "The prosecution must prove beyond reasonable doubt that the accused has committed the offence. At the same time the accused may after making his/her plea prove his case beyond reasonable doubt". Discuss the 'burden of proof' on the part of the State and an accused taking the support of constitutional guarantees. K2 CO1 (7)
