 - Surgical intervention

- Districiasis

- Stye
- Blepharitis
- Swelling
- Tumour



Pus formation or floaters in eye

- Keratitis precipitates in aqueous humor
- Vitreous floaters
- Vitreous haemorrhage
- PVD or RD
- Endophthalmitis
- Orbital cellulitis
