




- 1798: Essay on the Principle of Population as it Affects the Future Improvement of Society.

WORLD POPULATION BY RELIGION

- According to a recent study (based on the 2010 world population of 6.9 billion) by <u>The Pew Forum</u>, there are:
- **2,173,180,000 Christians** (**31%** of world population), of which 50% are Catholic, 37% Protestant, 12% Orthodox, and 1% other.
- 1,598,510,000 Muslims (23%), of which 87-90% are Sunnis, 10-13% Shia.
- **1,126,500,000** No Religion affiliation (16%): atheists, agnostics and people who do not identify with any particular religion. One-in-five people (20%) in the United States are religiously unaffiliated.
- 1,033,080,000 Hindus (15%), the overwhelming majority (94%) of which live in India.
- 487,540,000 Buddhists (7%), of which half live in China.

- India 2020 population is estimated at 1,380,004,385 people at mid year according to UN data.
- India population is equivalent to 17.7% of the total world population.
- India ranks number 2 in the list of <u>countries</u> (and <u>dependencies</u>) by <u>population</u>.
- The population density in India is 464 per Km² (1,202 people per mi²).
- The total **land** area is 2,973,190 Km2 (1,147,955 sq. miles)
- **35.0** % of the population is **urban** (483,098,640 people in 2020)
- The median age in India is 28.4 years.
