- Business ethics can be defined as written and unwritten codes of principles and values that govern decisions and actions within a company.
- In the business world, the organization's culture sets standards for determining the difference between good and bad decision making and behavior.

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## Importance of Business Ethics

- Public expects business to exhibit high levels of ethical performance and social responsibility.
- Encouraging business firms and their employees to behave ethically is to prevent harm to society.
- Promoting ethical behavior is to protect business from abuse by unethical employees or unethical competitors.
- High ethical performance also protects the individuals who work in business.

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## Fairness and honesty

- The heart of business ethics  
General values of decision makers



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## Conflict of interest

- Occurs when a person must choose whether to advance their own personal interest or those of others



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## Communication

- False and misleading advertising and deceptive personal-selling tactics anger customers and may cause a business to fail



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## Business relationships

- Business people must be ethical toward their customers, suppliers, and others in their workplace



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# Reasons for Not Reporting

## Observed Misconduct

1. Didn't believe corrective action
2. Feared retribution from supervisor
3. Feared they wouldn't remain anonymous
4. Thought someone else would report the misconduct
5. Didn't know who to contact



## Six Steps to Improve Business Ethics

- 1.Top management support
- 2.Expectations begin at the top
- 3.Ethics imbedded in training
- 4.Ethics office set up
- 5.External stakeholders informed
- 6.There must be enforcement
